In 1977 Burrard Yacht Club purchased property in North Vancouver at 10 Gostick Place where the clubs main facility is currently located.

Today Burrard Yacht Club has 200 + deep water berths and has seven (7) outstations located in: Indian Arm, Pender Harbour, Silva Bay, Ekins Point, Shawl Bay, Snug Cove and Gibsons Landing

Burrard Yacht Club has always been a “family” oriented club with the advent of the junior sailing program in 2000. The sailing program was introduced to keep the younger members involved and interested in boating. Burrard Yacht Club has now expanded this program, inviting the community to participate.

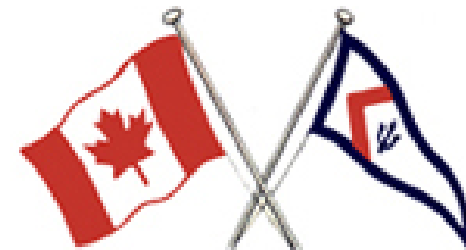
The goal of the sailing program at Burrard Yacht Club is to give the children an opportunity to learn water safety, learn to sail and introduce them to a future in boating.

Sailing Program 2010

The training facility used for Burrard Yacht Club's sailing program is the area in front of Waterfront Park, North Vancouver, BC land Based instruction takes place at BYC — 10 Gostick Place, North Vancouver, BC where the boats are stored.

Classes are designed to be kept small, thus enabling greater one on one instruction with each student enrolled in the program.

CYA Certification is included in the course fee, however texts must be purchased separately.

Daily activities include a variety of day trips, Friday BBQ's along with numerous land and water based games. Students must provide their own MOT certified PFD (Life Jacket) with attached whistle. Students are also expected to dress appropriately for the weather and use Sun Protection.

Students are required to remain at BYC under the supervision of the instructor throughout the day. The students must also provide their own lunches when not provided.

Levels I, II and III are introductions to sailing, taught in two week, full day courses. Students learn water safety, rigging of boat knots, sailing terminology and points of sail boat handling, capsizing and sailing rules.

Bronze IV, V and Silver advanced are taught in three week Courses.
