

## **HISTORY OF THE BURRARD YACHT CLUB**

Burrard Yacht Club (BYC) was founded in 1932 and was originally located in Coal Harbour. In 1977 BYC purchased property in North Vancouver at 10 Gostick Place where the club's main facility is currently located.

Today BYC has 200 + deep water berths and has seven (6) outstations located in: Indian Arm, Pender Harbour, Silva Bay, Ekins Point, Snug Cove and Gibsons

BYC has always been a "family" oriented club with the advent of the junior sailing program in 2000. The sailing program was introduced to keep the younger members involved and interested in boating. BYC has now expanded this program, inviting the community to participate.

The goal of the sailing program at BYC is to give the children an opportunity to learn water safety, learn to sail and introduce them to a future in boating.

The training facility used for Burrard Yacht Club's (BYC) sailing program is the area in front of Waterfront Park, North Vancouver. Land Based instruction takes place at BYC — 10 Gostick Place, North Vancouver, where the boats are stored.

Classes are designed to be kept small, thus enabling greater one on one instruction with each student enrolled in the program.

CYA Certification is included in the course fee, however texts must be purchased separately. Daily activities include a variety of day trips, Friday BBQ's along with numerous land and water based games. Students must provide their own MOT certified PFD (Life Jacket) with attached whistle. Students are also expected to dress appropriately for the weather and use Sun Protection.

Students are required to remain at BYC under the supervision of the instructor throughout the day. The students must also provide their own lunches when not provided.

### Courses offered for 2017

Canadian Yachting Association sailing program overview:

CANSail 1—This course is an introduction to sailing, covering water safety, rigging, sailing terminology and basic maneuvers.

CANSail II This is the transition course from

CANSail 1, continue with water skills, sailing theory, knots, capsizing and sailing rules.

CANSail 3 & 4—This Course consolidates the skills in CANSail 1 & 2. Students will learn further technical aspects of sailing.
